A \$90.00 supply fee will be charged to each child's account at the beginning of the school year. Having Providence Academy purchase items at discount/bulk rates allows parents to avoid the hassle of searching multiple stores for specific items on the school supply list. Additionally, parents will not be asked to send in classroom supplies during the school year.
