DATES AND TIMES

The Providence Academy Summer Activities are offered from June 13 through August 12. The full day camp, P.A.L.S. Camp, will offer additional sessions from August 15 to August 19. Please note that the Providence Academy Summer Activities will NOT be conducted on Monday, July 4 in observance of the Independence Day holiday.

A completed Providence Academy Summer Activities registration with emergency contact and medical information is required for each participant. Also, an authorization for administration of medication is needed if applicable. Payment for the full amount of tuition will need to have been made in order for the registration to be considered complete.

Classes are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Students should register for activities based on the grade that they will attend in the fall of 2016. All Providence Academy Summer Activities registration materials are due to Providence Academy by Thursday, May 12, 2016.

TUITION PAYMENT

Tuition for each activity is listed in the Providence Academy Summer Activities Guide. Payment in full is required to complete a registration.

A \$25 fee will be assessed for payment that cannot be processed because of insufficient funds in an account or a declined credit card.

SUPERVISION

All students in the building must be under adult supervision. If there is a span of one hour or less between two consecutive activities that your child (age 5 - entering grade 6) is registered for, he/she may participate in the P.A.L.S. Camp for a fee of \$10/hour.

ABSENCES

Tuition will not be prorated or refunded due to school closings, family vacations or conflicting activities. If a student is asked to withdraw from an activity because of inappropriate conduct, a refund will not be issued. A refund for medical reasons is applicable for absences of two days or longer, and a doctor's note is required.

Information, Terms, and Policies

REFUND POLICY

A \$50 administrative fee will be retained for all cancellations. No refunds will be granted for registrations cancelled after Thursday, May 12, 2016. This is to ensure programmatic commitments to families and to have proper staffing for all summer activities. This policy includes cancellations due to vacation schedules, change of plans and/or conflicting activities. All requests for a refund must be submitted in writing to Providence Academy's Summer Activities Coordinator at 15100 Schmidt Lake Rd., Plymouth, MN 55446.

COMPORTMENT

The Providence Academy Summer Activities promote respect among individuals and does not tolerate foul or threatening language, harassment or bullying. Students may be asked to withdraw from the program if this policy is violated.

ATTIRE

Camp participants and staff are required to dress appropriately for The Providence Academy Summer Activities. Clothing must be neat, clean, modest, and free of offensive advertisements and slogans. Participants that dress outside of these expectations may be required to change into more appropriate attire.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Students are expected to be present at the appropriate meeting location at the start of the activity. All students must be picked up by the end of the respective activity. Providence Academy reserves the right to charge a late pick up fee in the event a child is not picked up by the end of his/her session time. The fee is \$1 per minute, per child.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Providence Academy reserves the right to cancel any class or activity. In the event of a cancellation, Providence Academy will make every effort to notify families at least two weeks prior to the start of an activity. If an activity is cancelled, participants will have the option of applying the tuition towards another program or obtaining a full refund.

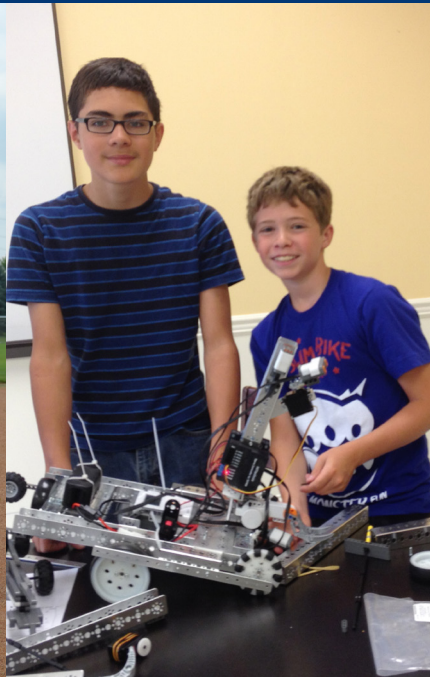
