## Eight Seniors Receive Top Marks from National Merit Scholarship Program

PLYMOUTH, MINN. (Sept. 24, 2018)—Providence Academy seniors Caitlin Heaney, Michael Mahoney, Connor McIntee, Gabriella Munger, and Harrison Vetter have been recognized as National Merit Semifinalists. These five students are among 16,000 from across the nation who were announced as National Merit Semifinalists by the National Merit Scholarship Program.

These academically talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition for some 7,500 National Merit Scholarships worth more than \$31 million that will be offered in the spring. To be considered for a Merit Scholarship award, semifinalists must fulfill several requirements to advance to the finalist level of the competition. Over 90 percent of the semifinalists are expected to attain finalist standing, and about half of the finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship, earning the Merit Scholar title.

In addition to the five Semifinalists, seniors Eleanor Christianson, Dylan Drean, and Clara McMillan have been recognized as National Merit Commended students. These individuals show exceptional academic promise, as they are among the top 50,000 scorers of more than 1.6 million students who entered the 2019 competition by taking the PSAT/NMSQT as juniors.

We are seeing actual growth in achievement among Providence Academy (PA) students at the highest levels: no fewer than 37 PA students in five years have scored at or above the 99th percentile on College Board college entrance exams.
