LETTER FROM THE HEADMASTER



Dear Families, Alumni, and Friends,

Last school year, which is commemorated in this report, was a year like no other in “a school like no other.” So many student achievements in academics, arts, and athletics. One of our largest graduating classes. All was going well, so very well. Friday, March 13, would be a highlight. Our girls’ varsity basketball team had won a big state quarterfinal game at the U on Wednesday. They were headed to Williams Arena for the semifinal game. We got word on Thursday that, due to the novel coronavirus, attendance on Friday would be greatly restricted. Friday morning the playoffs were cancelled. I told the girls, “You are undefeated in state play!”

At the close of school that day, we were wishing students a happy spring break. “See you in two weeks!” I said. Several responded, “You’ll see us next year, Dr. Flanders...” They were right.

So began Providence Academy’s journey into “distance learning,” and our preparations for an even more extraordinary year to follow. We are so grateful for the patience and support of students and families during these times, and to the faculty and staff for unwavering devotion to the kids under demanding circumstances. We were moved by the outpouring of support last year for the Annual Fund; several families gave additional gifts during the challenging spring months. Many supported an additional fund to provide relief for families impacted by COVID-19. One family also supported the school in facilitating a commencement ceremony for the ages, with outdoor concert staging previously used by Pearl Jam. As I say, we are so grateful!

You will note that Providence ran an operations deficit last year. Non-tuition revenue streams declined to nearly zero beginning in March, at a time when most of the school’s costs for the year were already spent or committed. These facts highlight again how valuable your contributions were during that exceptional time. Providence did apply for, and receive, a Payroll Protection Plan loan that offset the impact of governmental distance-learning mandates and the resulting deficit. In December 2020 the loan was forgiven, which, thankfully, has further put year-over-year operations on firm footing.

As I write, the new “more extraordinary” year is well underway. Inspired by Providence’s approach to distance learning, its resolve to open in September five days a week, and its fidelity to mission, new families have joined us in substantial numbers. Of course COVID-19 is still with us, and public health policies shape and delimit how we do school. But we are bold in putting children first in every way we can. It is exciting. It is the right thing to do. And we are guided by the Bible’s repeated insistence to “be not afraid.” Faith, knowledge, and virtue is our motto. Christ is our light. Whom shall we fear?

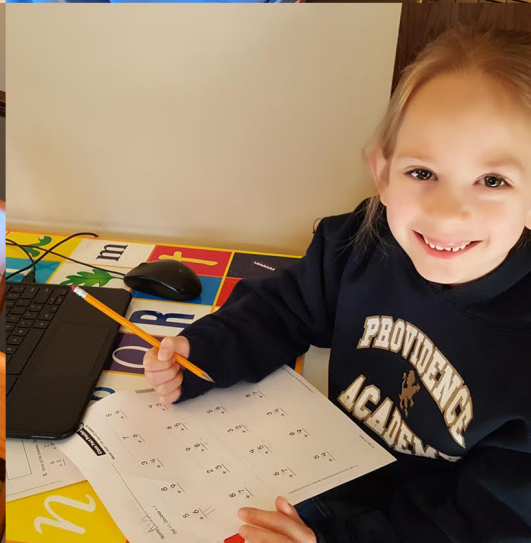
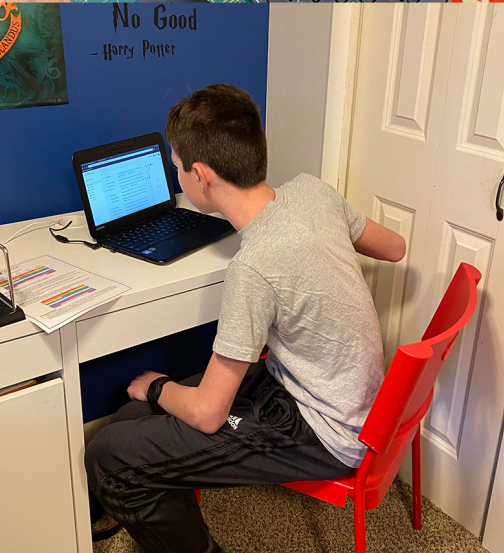
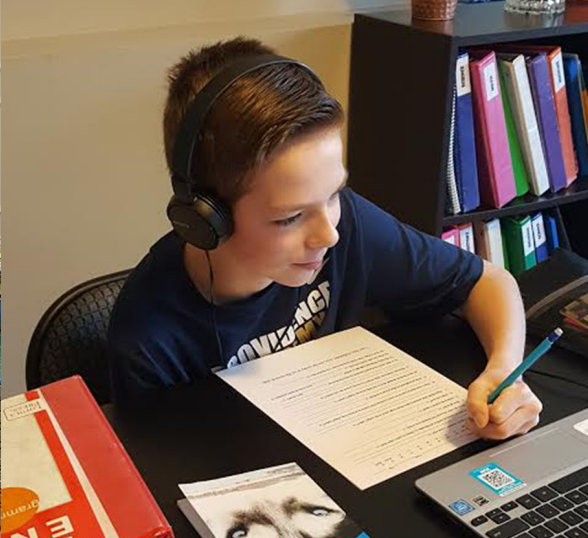
UPPER SCHOOL STUDENT PARTICIPATION
IN AT LEAST ONE ATHLETIC ACTIVITY



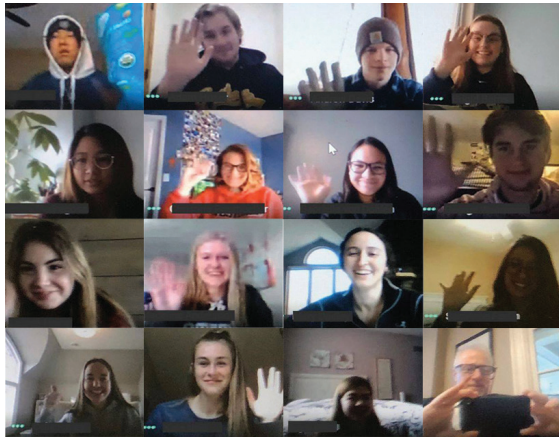

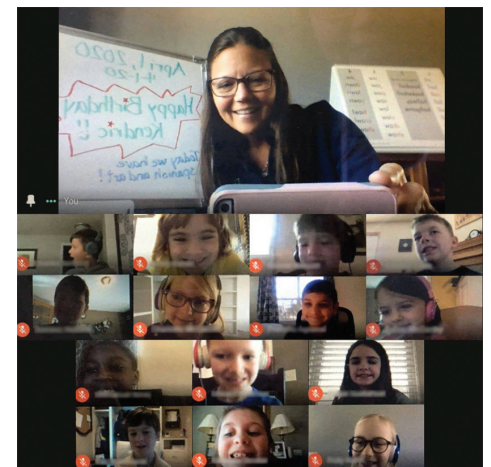

FAITH, KNOWLEDGE, VIRTUE AWARD

The highest award bestowed upon a graduating senior at Providence Academy is the **Faith, Knowledge, Virtue Award**. Recipients demonstrate strong Christian belief and commitment, achieve academic success through mastery of Providence's diverse and challenging curriculum, and serve as living examples of the virtues of faith, hope, charity, justice, courage and honesty. Recipients are chosen by the faculty and are awarded a \$1,500 scholarship to their chosen college or university. They are also given the honor of addressing their classmates with a valedictory speech at graduation.



SENIOR FINE ARTS AWARD

The **Senior Fine Arts Award** is awarded to one male and one female with outstanding accomplishments in the visual or performing arts. Recipients are nominated and selected by the Fine Arts Department faculty.



SENIOR ATHLETICS AWARD

The **Senior Athletics Award** is awarded to one male and one female demonstrating leadership, strong work ethic, dedication and achievement in athletics. Recipients are nominated and selected by Providence Academy's head coaches.

CLASS OF 2020 HONORS

FAITH, KNOWLEDGE, VIRTUE AWARD MARY DUDLEY



From her debut in Providence Academy's Middle School to Lions for Life President in Upper School, Mary Dudley's time at Providence was a testament to her drive toward a fulfilled, virtuous life, informed by faith and knowledge. At the helm of one of our largest school clubs, Mary helped organize the Lions for Life Annual 9/11 Tribute, the March for Life in Washington, D.C., and worked with peers to promote and respect life through organizing service opportunities alongside organizations with a similar mission, including pregnancy resource centers and elderly care facilities. She also brought her servant leadership to NHS with its myriad service activities, including tutoring younger students. His dedication and accomplishments throughout his Upper School tenure earned him the Benedictine College Book Award, induction into Providence's chapter of the National Honor Society, and recognition as both an AP Scholar and a National Hispanic Recognition Program Finalist through the College Board. CLASS OF 2020 ACADEMIC HONORS

Each year, Providence Academy recognizes academic distinctions based on grade point average and the intensity and rigor of course schedules. In the Class of 2020, six students earned Summa Cum Laude academic honors, twelve students earned Magna Cum Laude academic honors, and twelve students earned Cum Laude academic honors.

Additionally, the College Board recognizes students based on their Advanced Placement (AP) Exams performance. Nine students qualified for AP Scholar designations by passing (scoring 3 or higher) on three or more AP Exams. One student earned the title of AP Scholar with Honor by passing four or more exams with an average score of 3.25, and four students earned the title of AP Scholar with Distinction by passing five or more exams with an average score of 3.5.

National Honor Society members have met Providence Academy's standards of scholarship, service, leadership, and character.

National Merit finalists have scored in the top 16,000 students nationally on the PSAT in the fall of their junior year. National Merit commended students scored in the top 50,000 students.
