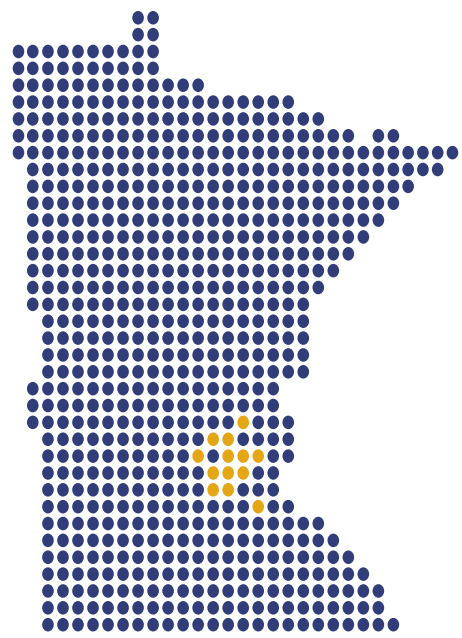
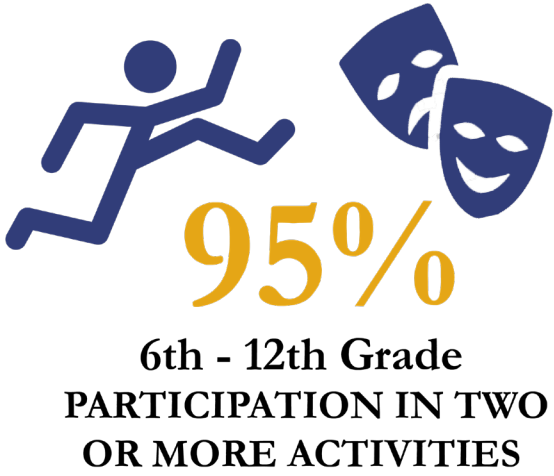
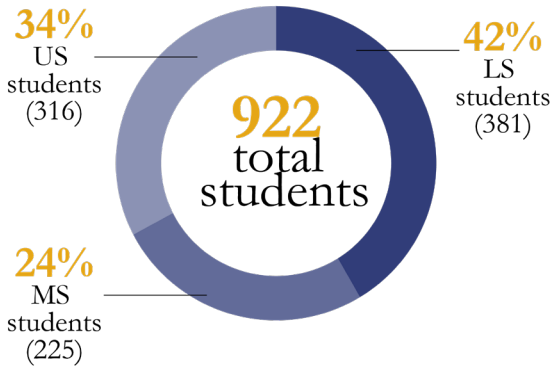
## Additional Grill Line

# Lower School

This year in the Lower School was full and exciting! As in the past, Lower School students learned to love God and appreciate the beauty in creation. The “Virtue Board” outside the main Administration office was filled each month with the names of Lower School students who modeled the love of Jesus to their friends at school. Students welcomed their grandparents and guests, cheered at Homecoming, enjoyed the Fall Fun Fair, waited with eager expectation through Advent for the joy of Christmas, danced the night away with their parents and classmates at the Sock Hop, and enjoyed the fun of Catholic Schools Week. Families came together to serve others at the PAPA-sponsored “Family Service Day,” and students shared the gifts that God has provided to others, near and far, through donations of Christmas toys and Easter baskets for needy children, cards to veterans in Plymouth, hygiene items for homeless clients at Mary’s Place in Minneapolis, donating money to build needed water collection facilities in Kitui, Africa, and more.

Students prayed throughout every day, worshipped reverently at weekly Mass, and observed the Stations of the Cross during Lent. In addition to reading, writing, and arithmetic, a majority of eligible students participated in school-sponsored band and orchestra. There was important learning: historical events and people, geography and civilizations, math and science, and there were games and feasts, field trips, and prayer services to help bring academic learning and the faith alive for students. The ever-popular Kidventures, Homework Club, and Little Pals extended-day programs grew to an average of more than 100 students daily. In addition to those programs, many Lower School students participated in enrichment programs in Engineering, Robotics, Chess, Science, and Theater production. It was a wonder-filled year!



# Middle School



An exciting year in Middle School began with a welcome to our large group of new students at orientation, as we welcomed 33 new students to PA this year to bring our enrollment to 225 students. Our 7th grade class of 2028 was again our largest Middle School class at 85 students strong. This year, school virtues were promoted in additional ways to grow our Middle School culture and remind our community of our most important values. In addition to our five core virtues, the student council selected four additional virtues of the month, choosing charity, perseverance, forgiveness and self-control. Each was introduced with a virtue assembly for all Middle School students to explain each virtue and give examples of saints who have lived out each virtue. Additionally, each virtue was celebrated with a Medal of Honor in each grade, and 27 students were honored with these medals. As a way of promoting our virtuous culture, the Positive Behavior Intervention Program (PBIP) system was revamped, with many students redeeming their good behavior tickets for candy, out of uniform days, or blizzards from the local Dairy Queen, which received plenty of business due to the work of our exemplary students.

While the school year brought many academic accomplishments and opportunities to grow in holiness, our Middle School students were also active in many activities during and after the school day. Our fine arts department put on many successful concerts throughout the year, and our Middle School students performed in *Sensical*, *The Music Man*, and our one-act play was expanded to two performances to accommodate all of the actors, actresses, and stage crew that wanted to participate. We celebrated Catholic Schools Week with our second annual ultima dodgeball tournament and a ski trip to Powder Ridge. As the year concluded, we celebrated the wonderful leadership of our 8th graders at their honorary banquet while students enjoyed field trips to Valleyfair, the Minnesota Zoo, French Park, Wolf Ridge, and Washington, D.C. Overall, it was an exciting year for our Middle School students to study hard, pray frequently, and grow in virtue.

# Upper School

The Upper School at Providence Academy continues to thrive! Our student population has increased in the last few years and will grow to our largest student body in the coming year. The Class of 2023 set a standard of excellence that will be hard to match, but more importantly, they set a standard for faith, knowledge, and virtue by their example. They will be sorely missed.

Many capstone events took place last school year, with state champions crowned, fine arts performers in the visual and performing arts decorated for their achievements, and scholars acknowledged. In addition to senior speech, a new endeavor, a senior project, launched with great success! We are blessed to have a one of kind faculty and staff that are the best in the industry. The class of 2023 certainly held the light of leadership proud during the 2022-2023 school year, and we look forward to what lies ahead with the class of 2024!

# Class of 2023 Honors

## FAITH, KNOWLEDGE, VIRTUE AWARD

The highest award bestowed upon a graduating senior at Providence Academy is the **Faith, Knowledge, Virtue Award**. Recipients demonstrate strong Christian belief and commitment, achieve academic success through mastery of Providence's diverse and challenging curriculum, and serve as living examples of the virtues of faith, hope, charity, justice, courage and honesty. Recipients are chosen by the faculty and are awarded a \$1,500 scholarship to their chosen college or university. They are also given the honor of addressing their classmates with a valedictory speech at graduation.

A Lifelong Lion, Alyson Marshall describes herself as petite and powerful. She has shown this to be true academically and athletically through her volunteerism and participation in the PA Theater and Speech programs. Alyson is a natural leader in all areas, and she always sets a quiet, consistent, faith-filled example for others. A seven-time State participant in Cross-Country and Track & Field, Alyson graduated Summa Cum Laude and plans to continue her running career at Denison University in Ohio.



**Nathan Dierberger**

Nathan became a PA Lion in the 9th grade. He is known to be steadfast and reliable as a strong student leader in our House system, on the athletic fields, and as a model of our faith. A three-sport athlete in Football, Basketball, and Tennis, Nathan was an All-Conference athlete in both Football and Tennis. 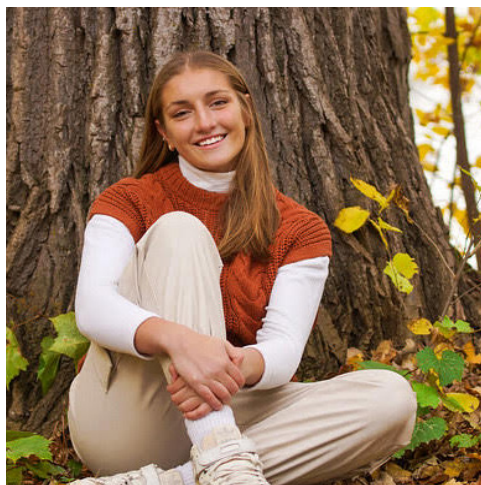


**Nathan Fish**

Grace Counts finished her basketball career at Providence Academy with honors and accolades that very few ever reach. A two-time State Champion in basketball, she was recognized both years as a Class AA All-Tournament team member and has also been recognized as a AA All-State player. In her career, Grace finishes at PA with 1,598 career points and a win-loss record of 107-13 over her four seasons with the Lions. She graduates as a champion in every way, and plans to continue her basketball career at the University of Minnesota-Duluth.



**Ryan Hutt**

Ryan is a quiet leader who leads by example in academic excellence, athletic prowess, and remarkable kindness. He is truly an all-around student-athlete. Ryan not only served as captain of the boys' soccer team but also switched from his All-Conference junior role as a defender to a forward his senior. Ryan embraced this new position, scoring more goals (18) in a single season than anyone in the history of PA boys soccer. As a result of his accomplishments and leadership, Ryan was awarded the Soccer Lions Achievement Award for the 2022 season, was selected All-Conference, and was an All-State nomination. Ryan will be attending the University of Notre Dame, this fall.

# Class of 2023 Academic Honors

Each year, Providence Academy recognizes academic distinctions based on grade point average and the intensity and rigor of course selection. In the Class of 2023, eight students earned Summa Cum Laude honors; nine students earned Magna Cum Laude honors; and sixteen students earned Cum Laude honors.

Additionally, the College Board recognizes students based on their Advanced Placement (AP) exams performance. Eleven students qualified for AP Scholar designation by passing three or more AP Exams. Three students earned AP Scholar with Honor by passing four or more exams with an average score of 3.25. Seven students earned AP Scholar with Distinction, passing five or more exams with an average score of 3.5.

National Honor Society members have met Providence Academy's standards of scholarship, service, leadership and character.

PA's National Merit Finalists were among the highest scores in Minnesota and in the top one-half of one percent among all students taking the PSAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. To achieve Finalist status, students must also have an outstanding academic record throughout high school, be endorsed and recommended by the school, and earn SAT scores that confirmed their earlier performance on the qualifying test, enabling them to compete for 7,250 National Merit Scholarships worth nearly \$28 million.

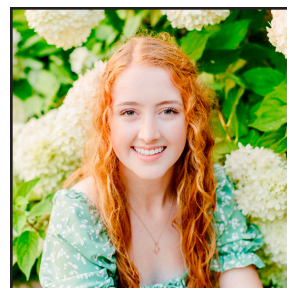

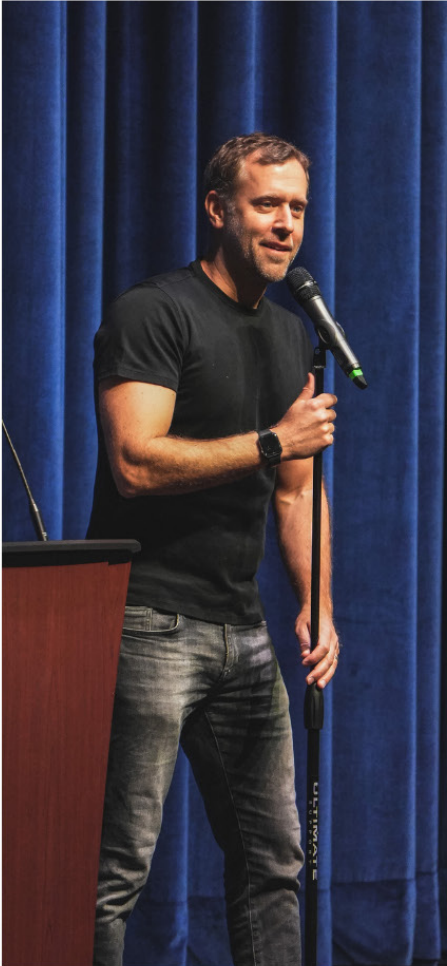

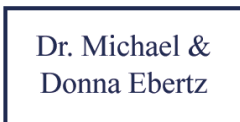
