



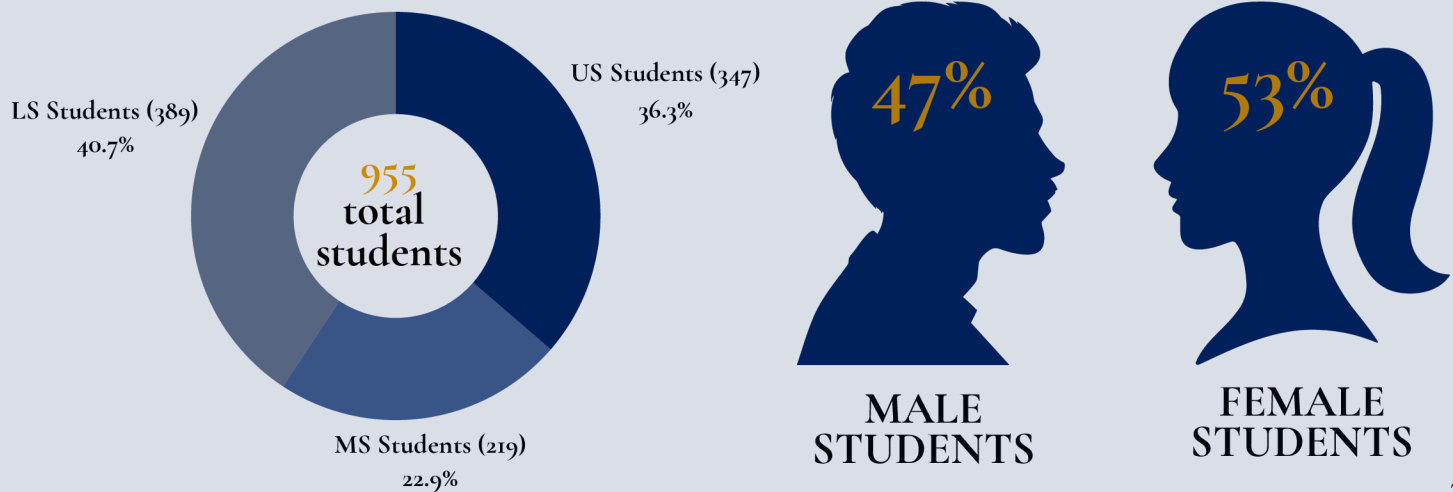

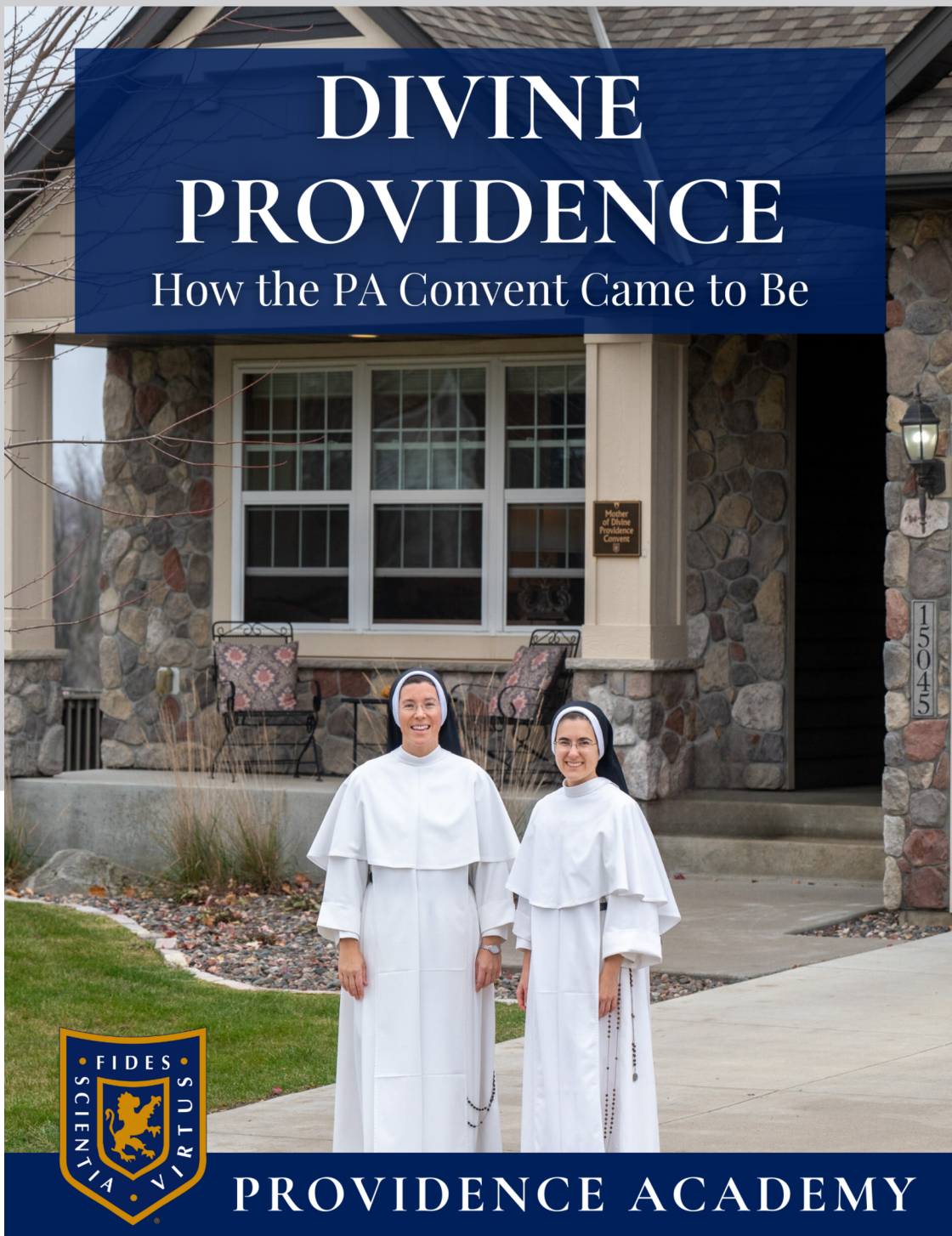

Lower School

With one of our largest enrollments ever, the Lower School experienced a year full of fun, learning, and laughter! We expanded our Lower School Buddies program to include Mass Buddies, which was very well received by both students and teachers. Our older Lower School students are wonderful role models for the younger ones, especially in guiding them on Mass expectations and behavior.

Catholic School Week brought many fun activities and dress-up days, and even included a day full of inflatables in the dome! The annual Sock Hop was a rocking success with hundreds of students and families attending. The big attraction is always the hula hoop contest, which was the longest contest ever! The final competitors were fierce, calling for some tough challenges to determine a winner. Our finalists were asked to hula hoop with one leg, one arm, even hop on one foot - it was an amazing feat to watch!

Springtime was marked by celebrating the crowning of our Mother Mary and showcasing our singing talents at our spring concerts. We wrapped up the year with some exciting field trips and one of our most beloved time-honored traditions - Lower School Field Day. This year, many Upper School students joined to assist in the Field Day events, making the day even more special.



Middle School



Providence Academy's Middle School was alive with energy and enthusiasm, welcoming several new students and bringing enrollment to 220. Our 7th grade class of 81 students, the largest in the division, filled classrooms, lunch tables, and school events with spirit and engagement. Monthly virtues were introduced through assemblies that explained and encouraged their practice, and students in each grade were honored with medals recognizing their growth in character.

Middle schoolers shone in academics, the arts, athletics, and service. On stage, they performed in *Elf Jr.* and *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe*, with several students also appearing in the Upper School's production of *Nunsies*. During Catholic Schools Week, students enjoyed skiing and a trip to Urban Air, and on our spring service day, they performed for residents of a local nursing home, packed boxes of food at Feed My Starving Children, and prepared supply bags for the homeless after hearing from a Catholic Charities speaker. Students also excelled in athletics, competing on state championship teams in girls soccer, girls basketball, and middle school ultimate frisbee, while an 8th grade swimmer qualified for the state meet. Our Providence Academy Quiz Bowl Team placed in the top five teams in the state and advanced to the national tournament in Chicago, showcasing both teamwork and academic excellence.

The year concluded with a middle school-wide celebration at Valleyfair, and our 8th graders were honored for their leadership at their end-of-year banquet. It was a year filled with hard work, joyful play, service to others, and spiritual growth as our students studied diligently, participated fully, and grew in virtue.

Upper School

In 2025 the Providence Academy Upper School experienced our largest graduating class in school history and our largest 9-12 enrollment. In the fall, we opened a new wing that featured 4 new science labs, a student services office, several new classrooms, and an art terrace. Enrollment certainly drove the need for more spaces but record interest in higher level science and math also was a major factor.

The class of 2025 left its mark with consistent excellence as a theme in athletics, arts, and academics. There were numerous conference, section, and state championships won. Including a first ever Girls Soccer Class 1A State Championship and a historic 4th straight Girls Basketball Class AA State Championship. Capstone performances, concerts, visual arts, coffee houses, and plays happened throughout the year, as well as many reasons to celebrate academic honors, scholarships, and impressive college matriculations.

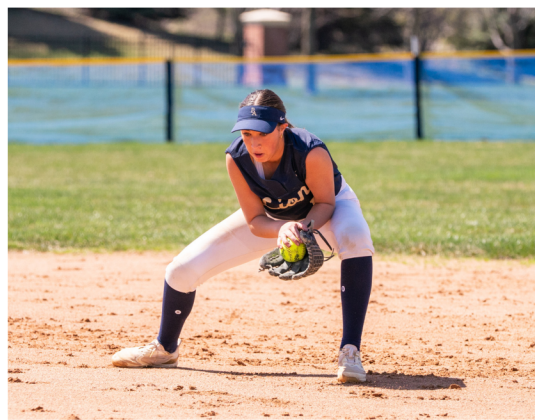

Class of 2025 Academic Honors

Each year, Providence Academy recognizes academic distinctions based on grade point average and the intensity and rigor of course selection. In the Class of 2024, eight students earned Summa Cum Laude honors; twelve students earned Magna Cum Laude; and twelve students earned Cum Laude honors.

Additionally, the College Board recognizes students based on their Advanced Placement (AP) exams performance. Eleven students qualified for AP Scholar by passing three or more AP Exams. Three students earned AP Scholar with Honor by passing four or more exams with an average score of 3.25. Seven students earned AP Scholar with Distinction, passing five or more exams with an average score of 3.5.

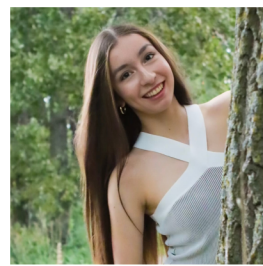

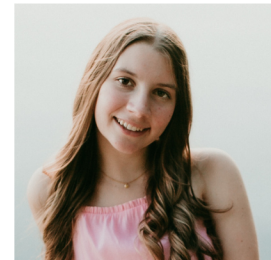

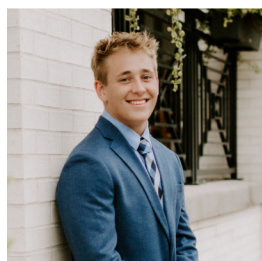
